












# Roald Dahl

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| <p><u><b>Making Giant Sweets</b></u></p> <p>Investigate how to make your sweets bigger, by leaving them in cold and warm water for a couple of hours. What happens?</p>  | <p><u><b>Make a Wormery.</b></u></p> <p>Mr and Mrs Twit love worms and Mrs Twit often secretly hides them in Mr Twit's spaghetti. Make a wormery that could be used to store the worms.</p>                              | <p><u><b>Invent a Roald Dahl sweet wrapper</b></u></p> <p>Dive into <i>Charlie and the Chocolate Factory</i> and use your creative side to design a sweet wrapper.</p>   | <p><u><b>It's my favourite.</b></u></p> <p>Write a letter to Matilda telling her about your favourite books. Why do you think she should read them?</p>    | <p><u><b>Marvellous Medicines.</b></u></p> <p>Write a recipe for George's next marvellous medicine. What would you include in your medicine?</p>    |
| <p><u><b>Nursery rhymes.</b></u></p> <p>Insert new words into well-know nursery rhymes to make them 'revolting'.</p>   | <p><u><b>Enormous Crocodile</b></u></p> <p>Create your own enormous crocodile (you can use anything you have: paper, cardboard, fabric, vegetables etc). Write a list of instructions telling me how you made it.</p>  | <p><u><b>Bruce Bogtrotter's Cake</b></u></p> <p>Bruce Bogtrotter was the little boy that stole a piece of chocolate cake from the Trunchbull in <i>Matilda</i>. As punishment, he then had to consume an <b>entire</b> cake in front of the whole school! Make your own cake and write instructions on how you made it.</p>  | <p><u><b>James and the giant peach.</b></u></p> <p>James shares the peach with many different animals. All of the insects have 6 legs; the centipedes have 100 legs and the humans have two!</p> <p>If there were 136 legs. How many insects, centipedes and humans could there be?</p>  | <p><u><b>What's the difference?</b></u></p> <p>Read one of the Roald Dahl books, such as <i>Fantastic Mr Fox</i>, and watch the film.</p> <p>Compare them, what is similar about them and what is different?</p>   |
