



Sports Premium grant expenditure: Report to governors: 2015/16

Rationale for SPG spending 2015/16

Sports Premium Funding was allocated to schools from April 2013. The grant must be used to enhance the provision of sports and PE in the school across Year 1 – 6 to encourage participation in sports and help pupils develop a healthy lifestyle.

The funding is ring-fenced and can therefore only be spent on PE and sport but schools have the freedom to choose how they do this. At BPS children receive at least 2 hours PE per week and there are a great many extra-curricular opportunities available to them through our clubs and sports teams across the year. Our rationale at BPS is that this funding should be used in a fully inclusive manner, to benefit all children not just elite sports. We believe in the nurturing of talent but also in giving opportunities to all children so that those who may not normally develop an active lifestyle are more able to do so, especially disadvantaged children. We have used a significant amount of the funding to buy in specialist coaches for year groups so that children benefit from high level coaching. This also provides excellent professional development for all teaching staff so that the quality of provision improves sustainably.

Due to the amount of time given to Forest Schools in Year 5 less provision was allocated to this year group in 2015/16 however this will be reviewed in 2016\17.

The school again achieved the Sainsbury's Silver Games Mark in 2016. We are targeting Gold in 2017.

New PE leads are revising this plan of expenditure for 2016/17 including no longer using Sports Premium funding to support the costs of swimming coaching in 2017/18 following the guidance received in October 2016.
