Rationale for SPG spending 2017/18 and impact

Sports Premium Funding was allocated to schools from April 2013. The grant must be used to enhance the provision of sports and PE in the school across Year 1 – 6 to encourage participation in sports and help pupils develop a healthy lifestyle. The level of funding was significantly increased in 2017

The funding is ring-fenced and can therefore only be spent on PE and sport but schools have the freedom to choose how they do this. At BPS children receive at least 2 hours PE per week and there are a great many extra-curricular opportunities available to them through our clubs and sports teams across the year. Our rationale at BPS is that this funding should be used in a fully inclusive manner, to benefit all children not just elite sports. We believe in the nurturing of talent but also in giving opportunities to all children so that those who may not normally develop an active lifestyle are more able to do so, especially disadvantaged children. We have used a significant amount of the funding to buy in specialist coaches for year groups so that children benefit from high level coaching. This also provides excellent professional development for all teaching staff so that the quality of provision improves sustainably.

We also use the Sports Premium Grant to meet the costs of entering competition, releasing staff to take children to competitions and festivals. We apply our principle of inclusivity so that a range of sports are included in this and to enable as many children as possible to take part, not just those who show an ability at sports.

From September 2018 we will be further supported in development of P.E. and sport provision by The Weald Secondary school. This will include provision of the Change4Life programme and catch-up swimming for children in Year 6 not yet able to swim 25m.

The school achieved the Sainsbury's Gold Games Mark award in June 2017. This award reflects the level of engagement of our pupils in high quality curricular and extra-curricular sports

activities. In the last academic year 52% of children from Y3 – Y6 took part in extra-curricular sporting activities and 18% of these were children who had previously been from the non-active population. We provided 13 Level 1 approved NGB competitions and 13 Level 3 competitions. Our older children ran a Change for Life course for less active younger children and 16% of children were engaged in leading, managing and officiating at sporting activities; every child is gaining the opportunity to Learn to Lead through curriculum PE. The school has links with 7 local community sports and leisure providers delivering curriculum teaching, clubs and taster sessions for our children. No child is disadvantaged in attending sports clubs: the school pays for attendance at paid for clubs through pupil premium and school fund. The school will again be preparing for the Sainsbury’s Award in June 2018 and these figures will be updated for this academic year.

In our current Year 6, 82% of children are able to meet the KS2 requirements of the swimming curriculum.
